1-10-1874 P.H. Conger, Deputy Surveyor, set a post for corner and witnessed as follows:

Poplar 4" North 40 degrees East 80 links (52.80 feet)

Poplar 3" South 29 degrees East 73 links (48.18 feet)

Said records are on file with the Secretary of State, St. Paul, MN

1919 Donald Clement, U.S. Surveyor, in a GLO resurvey found no evidence of original post or bearing trees. The corner was reestablished by double proportion from adjacent original corners. An iron post 3 feet long, 2 inches in diameter, with a brass cap was set and witnessed as follows:

Norway Pine 12" North 85 degrees East 130 links (85.80 feet)

Poplar 10" South 60 degrees East 301 links(198.66 feet)

Norway Pine 12" North 12 degrees West 225 links(148.50 feet)

9-19-1967 J. Ekstrom and L. Elliot, USFS, found a brass capped monument in place, they found a 24" Norway Pine North 84 degrees East 85.8 feet with scribe mostly worn off, a decayed burned stump North 11 degrees 45 minutes West 148.5 feet and rewitnessed as follows:
