The Town Clerk must not record this order within thirty days after filing, and not then, if an appeal has been taken, until the order is confirmed on appeal. But if no appeal is taken, or if on appeal this order is confirmed, it, together with the award, must be recorded and then transmitted to the County Auditor, to be filed and preserved by him.

County Auditor—General Laws 1888, Chapter 29, as amended General Laws 1893, Chapter 169, "eight legal voters who are freeholders and residents of the town within three miles of the road" to sign the petition. When such persons sign the petition it must be so stated on the blank line left for that purpose after the "Award of Damages."

State of Minnesota, County of Cass Town of Wray SS:

Whereas, Upon the petition of Leila Ort legal voters who own real estate or who occupy real estate under the homestead or pre-emption laws of the United States, or under contract from the State of Minnesota, within two (2) miles

of the road proposed in said petition to be Leila Ort; which said petition was filed with the Town Clerk previous to the time of posting copies thereof, and copies of said petition having been first duly posted up in three of the most public places of said Town, at least twenty days before any action was had in relation thereto, proof of which posting was duly shown to us by affidavit; which said proposed Leila Ort is set forth and described in said petition as follows, viz: Beginning

At skin pole corner horse, corner due north between the following sections to wit: 28, 33, 32 and 29, all in town 134 of R. 21, "terminating at N.W. corner of section 32, and with westerly corner of section 29,

And Whereas, Upon receiving said petition, we did, within thirty days thereafter, make out a notice and fix therein a time and place at which we would meet and decide, upon such application, to-wit: On the 25 day of August A. D. 1902 at skin pole corner horse

causing copies of such notice to be posted in three public places in said Town, at least ten days previous to such meeting; and having met at such time and place as above named in said notice, and being satisfied that the applicant had, at least ten days previous to said time, caused said notice of time and place of hearing to be given to all the occupants of the land through which such highway might pass, by serving the same personally or by copy left at the usual place of abode of each of said occupants, proof of which was shown by affidavit, we proceeded to examine personally such highway, and heard any and all reasons for or against the

..... the same, and being of opinion that such will was necessary and proper, and that the public interest would be promoted thereby, we granted the prayer of said petitioners and determined to lay out said road, and caused a survey thereof to be made according to the report and plat herewith accompanying, the description of which as so surveyed is as follows, to-wit: Beginning

It is Therefore Ordered and Determined, That a road be, and the same is hereby laid out and established according to the description last aforesaid, and the report and plat herewith accompanying, which is hereby made a part of this Order, and it is declared to be a public highway 4 rods wide, the said description above given being the center of said road.
