appeal is taken, or if on appeal this order is confirmed, it,  
together with the award, must be recorded and then trans-  
mitted to the County Auditor, to be filed and preserved by  
him.

TAKE NOTICE—General Laws 1885, Chapter 29, as amended  
General Laws 1893, Chapter 169 allows "eight legal voters  
who are freeholders and residents of the town within three  
miles of the road" to sign the petition. When such persons  
sign the petition it must be so stated on the blank line left  
for that purpose after the "Award of Damages," "Super-  
visors' Road Order" and "Award of Damages."

State of Minnesota, County of Cass Towns of Byron and Poplar SS:

Whereas, upon the petition of thirteen legal voters who own real estate or who occupy real estate under the homestead or pre-emption laws of the United States, or under contract from the State of Minnesota, within two (2) miles

of the road proposed in said petition to be laid out; which said petition was filed with the town clerk previous to the time of posting copies thereof, and copies of said petition having been first duly posted up in three of the most public places of said Town, at least twenty days before any action was had in relation thereto, proof of which posting was duly shown to us by affidavit; which said proposed new road is set forth and described in said petition as follows, viz: Beginning

at the North East corner of section one (1) Town 135 Range thirty two (32) and running west on the line between the Towns of Byron and Poplar a distance of two (2) miles to the North West corner of section two (2) town of Byron

And Whereas, upon receiving said petition, we did, within thirty days thereafter, make out a notice and fix therein a time and place at which we would meet and decide upon such application, to-wit: On the 29<sup>th</sup> day of July A. D. 1891 at ten o'clock in the fore noon, at the North West corner of section two, Town of Byron

causing copies of such notice to be posted in three public places in said Town, at least ten days previous to such meeting; and having met at such time and place as above named in said notice, and being satisfied that the applicant had, at least ten days previous to said time, caused said notice of time and place of hearing to be given to all the occupants of the land through which such highway might pass, by serving the same personally or by copy left at the usual place of abode of each of said occupants, proof of which was shown by affidavit, we proceeded to examine personally such highway, and heard any and all reasons for or against the laying out of the same, and being of the opinion that such proposed road was necessary and proper, and that the public interest would be promoted thereby, we granted the prayer of said petitioners and determined to lay out said road and caused a survey thereof to be made according to the report and plat herewith accompanying, the description of which as so laid out is as follows, to-wit: Beginning

at the North East corner of section one (1) Town 135 Range thirty two and running west on the line between the towns of Byron and Poplar a distance of two miles to the North West corner of section two in said town of Byron

It is Therefore Ordered and Determined, That a road be, and the same is hereby laid out and established according to the description last aforesaid, and the report and plat herewith accompanying, which is hereby made a part of this Order, and it is declared to be a public highway four (4) rods wide, the said description above given being the center of said road.
