Whereas, Upon the petition of them legal voters who own real estate or who occupy real estate under the homestead or pre-emption laws of the United States, or under contract from the State of Minnesota, within three (3) miles of the road proposed in said petition to be established; which said petition was filed with the Town Clerk, who forthwith presented it to us for action thereon, and which said proposed road is set forth and described in said petition as follows, viz: Beginning Commencing at the S.W. corner of Sec. 19, 141, 31 running north to within about 16 rd of Cat Creek, thence in an easterly direction, following creek, still easterly striking valley logging road, thence in an easterly direction following road, thence in an easterly direction around hills of Spring section line proceeding in same to N.W. corner of section 18 and proceeding practical.

Corner of Sec. 19, 141, 31 running north to within about 16 rd of Cat Creek, thence in an easterly direction, following creek, still easterly striking valley logging road, thence in an easterly direction around hills of Spring section line proceeding in same to N.W. corner of section 18 and proceeding practical.
Commencing 80 rods W. of S.E. corner of Section 31, running north to N.E. corner of W 1/2 of Sec 19 of Sec 31, thence follow path of hill on hillside 1/4 of around ground subject to interest above road as head of road and take.

And Whereas, Upon receiving said petition, we did, within thirty days thereafter, make out an order or notice of hearing and fix therein a time and place at which we would meet and act upon said petition to-wit: On the 5th day of July 1919, at Residence of Ole C. Larson

causing copies of such notice to be posted in three public places in said Town, at least ten days before such meeting; and having met at such time and place as above named in said notice, and being satisfied that the petitioners had, at least ten days previous to said time caused said notice of time and place of hearing to be given to all the occupants of the land through which such road might pass, by serving the same personally upon each of said occupants, proof of which was shown by affidavit, we proceeded to examine personally such roads, and heard all persons interested, and any and all reasons for or against the Proposed road was necessary and proper, and that the public interest would be promoted thereby, we granted the prayer of said petitioners and determined to grant said road, and caused a survey thereof to be made according to the report and plat herewith accompanying, the description of which as so is as follows, to-wit: Beginning

It is Therefore Ordered and Determined, That a road be, and the same is hereby a public road and established according to the description last aforesaid, and the report and plat herewith accompanying which is hereby made a part of this Order, and it is declared to be a public road from roads wide, the said description above given being the center of said road.

Whereas, A part of the damages sustained by reason of the laying out

said road has

been ascertained by the agreement of the owners of the lands through which said road passes, with us, and a part of the owners of the said lands have in writing released all claims to damages; but not being able to agree with the owners of the following described lands, claiming damages by reason of said road passing through, and the owners of some of the said lands being unknown, we have assessed the damages to each of such individual claimants with whom we could not agree, and awarded damages to the owners of such lands through which such road passes as are unknown, at what we deemed just and right; taking into account and estimating the benefits the road will confer on the claimants and owners, as well as the disadvantages. We have assessed and awarded damages as follows:
